

Chapter Eight : Ultra Violet Blood Irradiation Therapy - Nature's Wash

This is a very simple therapy wherein a small amount of blood is drawn from a patient, thoroughly oxygenated, treated with ultraviolet light and reintroduced intravenously back into the patient. The treatment was first introduced in the 1930's mainly to effectively combat the polio virus. Ultraviolet light has been used as proven disinfectant and decontaminant for many years. When human blood is treated with UV light and put back into the body, some mechanism increases the production of lymphokines and the immune system is activated to attack either cancer cells or invading organisms. Light therapy, especially the UV portion, has made it possible to cure a variety of ailments and the key to its versatility is the ability to cure through the stimulation of the body's own immune responses. It works extremely well on viral pneumonia, completely clearing up coughing and the toxic symptoms from the body and lungs between 3 to 7 days. There is no other therapy existing today that can accomplish that. The potential of this therapy was discovered in 1880 but it was put to use as an effective treatment only in 1934 and worked in over 95% of the cases without any harmful side effects. Many deadly toxins are quickly deactivated on exposure to UV light and the potential health benefits of such a phenomena are incalculable. Because of this anti-toxin property, UV therapy is one of the most effective snakebite treatments. UV therapy is a scientifically proven treatment that is totally safe, effective, easy to carry out, relatively inexpensive and resorted to even by orthodox physicians.
